The day before disaster, a community is self-sufficient. Services run, people work, goods move. When disaster strikes, that balance shatters. First responders handle the crisis. But full recovery depends on how fast local businesses get back in business to support the rest of the community recovery.

This guide defines 1000-plus concrete actions coordinated across 80 types of local organizations which can speed recovery after a disaster by using SpotOnResponse.

These actions help a community more quickly close the gap between disaster and self-sufficient.



Introduction

All recovery is local.

And in this new era of disaster management, **it's all about recovery.**

The day before a disaster, a community is self-sufficient. **Business** drives employment, commerce, the economy. **Government** provides public safety and infrastructure. **Nonprofits** provide a social safety net and culturally enrich neighborhoods. It's not perfect—but it works. Until disaster disrupts the system.

When crisis strikes, First Responders lead the lifesaving phase. Government agencies rush to restore power, water, and basic services. FEMA once helped coordinate the second wave—restoration and recovery. No longer.

With that federal support disappearing, communities are left to manage recovery alone, often without the tools to understand what's working, what's missing, or what's holding progress back.

The only way to fill the FEMA gap is to recognize where **recovery actually happens: Block by block.** By store clerks, health workers, teachers, truck drivers, home owners, neighbors.

But that doesn't mean recovery should be improvised. It should still be **coordinated, efficient, and effective.**

That's why this Playbook exists: to show how every organization, large or small, can contribute to bringing a community back to life. Whether you run a food bank, a factory, or a farmers market, you are part of the fabric that holds people together when systems break down.

There is one factor, however, that drives recovery more than any other: **business.**

It's essential to understand that **real recovery depends on how quickly local businesses reopen.** When they do, employees return, and goods and services start flowing. People get paychecks. Purchases resume. The local economy restarts. Taxes get paid so infrastructure gets fixed. Every reopened business triggers a chain reaction of renewal.

Which means **the key to recovery is getting businesses back in business — faster.**

That's why we created ***After FEMA: The Community Recovery Playbook.***

It helps communities:

- Assemble their recovery partnerships among businesses, governments, and nonprofits.
- Assess and map the commercial recovery landscape – risks, resources, roles – before disaster hits
- Enable each organization to self-report status during a crisis to trigger the right help and monitor the community's return.
- Prioritize private-sector reopening—not just as a goal, but as a shared responsibility of governments and other partners.

- And above all: **share information freely among recovery partners** to support mutual aid and rapid action.

The Playbook complements emergency response by focusing on the next critical phase: **rebuilding everyday life**.

Practically speaking, recovery begins as soon as the danger ends – in grocery stores and gas stations, housing authorities and water boards, nonprofits and neighborhood watch groups. Not from a distant command post, but from connections across the community.

This Playbook shows what those connections can look like. The Playbook is built on the belief that recovery should be visible, participatory, and mutual. Not top-down. Not invisible. Not outsourced.

Whether you're a school principal, a clinic coordinator, a business owner, or a transit supervisor, you are part of your community's resilience. You don't need a FEMA mission assignment to take action. You need a network.

How to Use This Playbook

Each entry in this playbook represents a type of organization commonly found in American communities. From food banks to fuel depots, housing authorities to hardware stores, each profile outlines how that group can prepare for and participate in community recovery using **SpotOnResponse** — a mobile app and web application built for local coordination.

Every profile follows a three-part structure:

- **Coordinate in Advance** — How the organization prepares to speed their own recovery and establish connections across the community before disaster strikes.
- **Communicate During Events** — How the organization type shares operational updates in real time.
- **Cooperate to Recover** — How an organization joins the wider effort to restore services and reopen businesses to support the community. This is our focus.

Each section is packed with **actionable tasks** tied directly to SpotOnResponse features. These aren't generic tips. They are built from field experience and powered by the actual tools used inside SpotOnResponse.

What It Looks Like in Practice

Here's how you start:

1. **Connect the right partners.** This Playbook shows you which organizations sustain the community every day and what each can do to fill FEMA's absence in an emergency.

2. **Equip them with SpotOnResponse.** Use ready-made templates for plans, rosters, road closures, shelter maps, and more — or build custom forms in minutes. It’s fast, intuitive and yes... even a 12-year-old can help.

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Organization Type: Banks & Credit Unions

Banks and credit unions are financial lifelines during disaster recovery, helping residents and businesses access funds, manage insurance transactions, and stabilize local economies.

Coordinate in Advance

Map assets, define roles, and pre-stage continuity plans for financial lifelines.

- Upload branch and ATM continuity plans for reference during access disruptions.
- Tag facilities, routes, or assets as IOIs and pre-load response plans using MyPlans.
- Mark essential locations for armored transport and customer access on shared map.
- Locate backup power and network redundancy details for high-priority restoration.

Communicate During Events

Deliver visibility on financial operations, staff availability, and service interruptions.

- Share real-time status updates for branch openings and closings.
- Submit SpotReports to notify partners of ATM availability, mobile banking operations, service updates or damage reports in real-time.
- Check in employees via mobile app to verify availability across multiple branches.
- Post when mobile banking units are deployed or relocated.

Cooperate to Recover

Aid economic stabilization among businesses by lending and funding information through facility status updates, resource tracking, and staff check-ins.

- Update store status using IOI status selectors (Closed → Limited → Reopen) visible to partners.
- Share field observations of damage or spoilage using SpotReports with tagged photos.
- Use heatmaps to visualize service gaps in food access by recovery stage.
- Upload donation logs, resource requests, and vendor updates as documents.
- Check in staff to confirm operational readiness or request surge support via mobile app.
- Map underserved zones needing ATM/cash access post-disaster.
- Mark facilities as IOIs and update recovery status from Closed to Limited to Reopen.
- Submit SpotReports to document field status with photos or voice recordings.
- Attach recovery plans, repair docs, or funding forms as DOIs to each facility.
- Use report view to monitor restoration progress across neighborhoods or sectors.
- Check in staff or volunteers at recovery sites using GPS-linked mobile tools.
- Connect with chambers, insurers, and grant programs for coordinated aid delivery.
- Share reopening progress and gaps in financial service access using geotagged updates.
- Exchange real-time updates on banking infrastructure damage and resource needs.

Organization Type: Big Box Stores

Big Box Stores are vital anchors of local supply chains, offering essential goods, large-scale logistics, and staging areas that can support both community response and recovery efforts before, during, and after disasters.

Coordinate in Advance

Document locations, capabilities, and recovery roles of each store.

- Create business locations for each store and preload MyPlans with floor plans and emergency contacts.
- Create or use templates of custom forms to capture standard inventory levels, backup generators, and logistics assets.
- Map stores with fuel, pharmacy, or high-demand supply roles to inform partner planning.
- Use DOIs to attach utility shutoff points, emergency supplier contacts, and access instructions.

Communicate During Events

Enable real-time communication with staff, suppliers, and public agencies.

- Send Announcements to alert regional partners of closures, curfews, or special inventory availability.
- Submit SpotReports with tagged images to show parking lot staging, delivery access, or supply disruptions.
- Use business status selectors (Closed, Limited, Reopen) to share operating hours and capacity.
- Confirm team Check-ins for shift changes, damage checks, or site security needs.

Cooperate to Recover

Support rapid community recovery through reliable services, coordination, and logistical support.

- Post SpotReports to document store readiness, safety conditions, or reopening progress.
- Track staff Check-ins to verify store operations and emergency roles.
- Update IOIs with recovery-focused overlays (e.g., debris zones, access routes, delivery lanes).
- Use report view to monitor reopening across multiple locations and identify unmet supply needs.
- Upload community-specific support materials to MyPlans—such as donation programs, aid partner coordination plans, or repair contractor contacts.
- Run Profile Reports to track team roles, response gaps, and coordination with emergency partners.
- Coordinate with public safety for traffic flow, staging access, or essential goods delivery via shared maps.
- Use SpotReports and photos to provide documentation for insurance, grant programs, or public transparency.

Organization Type: Chambers of Commerce/Main Street Associations

Chambers of Commerce and Main Street Associations are the pulse of local economic life, convening business leaders, coordinating mutual aid, and providing vital communication links before, during, and after disaster.

Coordinate in Advance

Map members, readiness needs, and mutual aid agreements before disaster strikes.

- Upload member contact lists and essential functions using the mobile app.
- Create IOIs for member businesses and preload MyPlans with reopening guides and assessment checklists.
- Map key businesses with cold storage, delivery fleets, or communications roles.
- Prepare checklists and upload business-specific recovery templates.

Communicate During Events

Connect hundreds of businesses to real-time updates, priorities, resources and post-disaster needs quickly.

- Use SpotReports to share sector-wide damage summaries or business readiness snapshots.
- Confirm operational status from businesses using business status reporting.
- Send targeted updates through Announcements to business groups based on mapped location or sector.
- Visualize area-wide readiness via uploaded member check-ins.

Cooperate to Recover

Fuel economic rebound by tracking reopening, restoring services, and supporting aid flow.

- Disseminate business reopening data to identify momentum and unmet needs.
- Coordinate by mapping and sharing aid resource drop points for business zones in need.
- Map utility and permitting delays affecting recovery timelines.
- Map business district participants as IOIs and update reopening status using status selectors.
- Receive SpotReports from businesses with tagged images to document reopening challenges.
- Use report view to visualize economic recovery across sectors and track unmet needs.
- Upload grant resources, repair vendor lists, and reentry protocols to MyPlans for chamber members.
- Coordinate volunteer business assessments using mobile check-in and custom forms.
- Organize member collaboration by sharing mutual aid and needs custom forms.

Organization Type: Construction/Trades Businesses

Construction and trade companies are vital for post-disaster rebuilding, debris removal, and infrastructure restoration. Their mobilization affects housing, utilities, and essential services.

Coordinate in Advance

Preload contractor details and site logistics to accelerate deployment.

- Register contractor profiles with skillsets, certifications, and equipment details.
- Tag job sites as IOIs and store safety plans, permits, and vendor contacts in MyPlans.
- Define staging areas and upload layout plans for debris removal and heavy equipment zones.
- Pre-identify sites with hazardous materials or specialized access needs on shared map.

Communicate During Events

Keep all stakeholders informed of site progress, safety status, and supply chain issues.

- Report site progress using photo uploads and field observations.
- Collect and publish field updates with SpotReports showing project delays or crew needs.
- Post status of material deliveries and equipment movement in real time.
- Notify inspectors or utility crews when sites are ready for next stage.

Cooperate to Recover

Rebuild faster by mapping repair status, connecting specialties, and tracking completion.

- Track work order completion and remaining gaps using map overlays and custom forms.
- Track site recovery progress with GPS-linked check-ins and DOI photo documentation.
- Use SpotReports to flag supply shortages, safety hazards, or staging updates from the field.
- Upload permits, inspection reports, and utility restoration logs to each job site's IOI.
- Visualize work zones with drawn polygons or imported overlays to coordinate crew deployment.
- Run Profile Reports to monitor personnel availability and certification status across projects.
- Coordinate inspections across multiple agencies with shared site data.
- Share availability of construction crews for mutual aid deployments.
- Post recovery timelines by zone for integration with housing and business reopenings.
- Use shared forms to document permitting steps and restoration issues.

Organization Type: Convenience Stores & Gas Stations

Convenience stores and gas stations are often the first reopened businesses after a disaster, offering critical access to food, water, fuel, and information. Their operational status affects supply chains and morale.

Coordinate in Advance

Identify and protect essential locations in the fuel supply chain before disruption occurs.

- Map fuel stations and supply stores across jurisdictions in shared platform.
- Register IOIs for each site and upload alternative emergency supply agreements and priority delivery contacts.
- Pre-load emergency fueling priority lists and alternate vendor contacts.
- Mark stores with generator capacity or secure storage capability.

Communicate During Events

Provide up-to-date visibility on site status, outages, and resupply condition, fuel, supplies, and operating hours.

- Send real-time updates about fuel availability and restocking status.
- Share inventory status or fuel disruptions through business status reporting with geotagged photos.
- Check in with staff and supply chain partners to confirm readiness.
- Share facility status changes to guide responder refueling routes.

Cooperate to Recover

Strengthen community resilience by stabilizing fast-access resources and partnerships to assure resupply coordination.

- Coordinate fuel access for emergency vehicles and mobile aid stations.
- Mark fuel stations and retail locations as Static IOIs and update status through the app.
- Submit SpotReports for inventory levels, cold storage failures, or generator use.
- Coordinate restocking by uploading supplier contact lists and delivery schedules to DOIs.
- Track accessibility issues and outages on shared maps with geotagged reports.
- Use report view to identify which locations are open, limited, or still closed post-event.
- Display neighborhood access gaps and identify priority restocking areas.
- Enable stores to request deliveries or support through recovery forms.
- Post shared reopening milestones for gas corridors and resupply zones.
- Track retail service restoration trends for food, water, hygiene supplies.

Organization Type: Grocery Stores

Grocery stores serve as central access points for food, water, and daily necessities. Their reopening is a key milestone in recovery, often tied to community stability and nutrition access.

Coordinate in Advance

Ensure food availability by mapping essential stores, supply chains, and refrigeration dependencies.

- Create IOIs for each store and use MyPlans to store emergency contacts, priority routes, and vendor files.
- Pre-stage continuity plans and upload cold-chain supply details.
- Identify stores with emergency food storage or nonprofit donation roles.
- List alternate supplier networks in mobile app directory.

Communicate During Events

Keep agencies, suppliers, and communities informed of food availability and store conditions.

- Post opening hours and inventory status to shared platform.
- Submit SpotReports from the field to show photos of store damage or spoiled goods, spoilage, or power restoration updates.
- Submit to assist with aid requests.
- Alert partners of restocking schedules and access restrictions.

Cooperate to Recover

Drive local recovery by stabilizing food access with recovery timelines, geotagged reports, and cross-sector coordination.

- Coordinate with food banks and delivery providers to meet critical needs.
- Update store status using IOI status selectors (Closed → Limited → Reopen) visible to partners.
- Share field observations of damage or spoilage using SpotReports with tagged photos.
- Use heatmaps to visualize service gaps in food access by recovery stage.
- Upload donation logs, resource requests, and vendor updates as DOI documents.
- Check in staff to confirm operational readiness or request surge support via mobile app.
- Track inventory levels by neighborhood to prioritize deliveries.
- Use mobile surveys to assess recovery challenges in food access.
- Share trends on food availability and high-demand items to assist planning.
- Monitor cold storage reliability and coordinate maintenance via alerts.

□ Organization Type: Hardware/Home Improvement Stores

Hardware and home improvement stores are essential supply nodes for rebuilding homes, restoring utilities, and supporting neighborhood-level repairs. Their role expands in the weeks after disaster.

Coordinate in Advance

Pre-stage building recovery materials and service contacts for fast access.

- Map store locations, warehousing capacity, and generator access on shared platform.
- Tag each location as an IOI and use MyPlans to store vendor lists and emergency supplier protocols.
- Preload recovery product inventory lists and supplier contact information.
- Tag facilities with roles in tarp, plywood, or sanitation distribution.

Communicate During Events

Alert community partners about available tools, generators, and supplies during response.

- Post restocking updates and material availability in mobile app.
- Use SpotReports to broadcast hardware supply availability or repair kit distribution status.
- Check in staff and delivery crews to confirm store and fleet status.
- Use field reports to show damage conditions or anticipated reopening times.

Cooperate to Recover

Support local rebuilds by tracking supply chains, sharing status, inventory visibility, and coordination tools.

- Coordinate supply access for nonprofits, builders, and public works crews.
- Visualize supply shortfalls by neighborhood to guide resource deliveries.
- Mark store locations as IOIs and assign status to reflect open or limited operation.
- Use SpotReports to report inventory changes or distribution activities.
- Upload generator instructions, safety bulletins, or shelter supply guides as DOIs.
- Enable customer check-ins to request urgent items or verify location capacity.
- Use report view to track inventory availability and store status by zone.
- Provide live updates on generator, plumbing, and roof repair essentials.
- Share surge demand trends with emergency managers to anticipate needs.
- Enable mobile requests for bulk materials or pickup coordination.

Organization Type: Hotels/Motels/Lodging

Hotels and motels become temporary housing sites for displaced residents, emergency workers, and volunteers. Their availability affects mobility, safety, and service restoration.

Coordinate in Advance

Catalog room capacity, special needs access, re-entry procedures and staff availability in advance.

- Upload emergency occupancy plans and list special use agreements.
- Create IOIs for each property and use MyPlans to save contact information, ADA access data, and overflow planning protocols.
- Tag facilities with generator backup and accessible accommodations.
- Prepare re-entry readiness checklists and contact rosters in the app.

Communicate During Events

Alert partners when shelter space opens or evacuee reception shifts due to damage or capacity by linking lodging capacity with local needs.

- Update room availability and guest types (displaced, responder, etc.) via app.
- Share status changes such as closures, utility loss, or safety concerns.
- Notify responders of lodging capacity by proximity or sector role.

Cooperate to Recover

Support displaced residents, workers, and responders through visible, flexible lodging coordination with housing agencies and partner organizations.

- Mark hotel IOIs and track operational status with Closed → Limited → Reopen tags.
- Share room counts, evacuee intake policies, and support needs via SpotReports.
- Upload agreements with emergency managers or nonprofit housing partners to DOIs.
- Enable facility check-ins to coordinate staff, volunteers, and guest movement.
- Map shelter coverage and gaps to coordinate with social services and emergency response.
- Coordinate housing of mutual aid workers and medical teams with local EOCs.
- Map lodging zones to assist shelter transition planning.
- Share long-term vacancy trends to support housing and recovery placement.
- Use shared forms to track occupancy patterns and aid reimbursements.
- Enable hotel check-ins and guest status for cross-agency visibility.

Organization Type: Industrial & Manufacturing Facilities

Industrial and manufacturing facilities provide essential production, storage, and logistics functions—often involving hazardous materials, specialized labor, or key infrastructure inputs.

Coordinate in Advance

Secure plant continuity, workforce logistics, and resupply strategies by mapping facility roles, and critical dependencies in coordination with emergency operations.

- Identify locations with vital supply chain or hazardous materials significance.
- Create IOIs for factory locations and supplier routes; upload business continuity and reentry plans to MyPlans.
- Upload business continuity plans and access protocols to shared profiles.
- Pre-stage custom forms for reporting status of production lines and worker readiness.

Communicate During Events

Ensure visibility into hazardous sites, production readiness, and workforce status by notifying partners and customers about shutdowns, damage, or production restart status.

- Post operational status updates for plants, warehouses, and support facilities.
- Use SpotReports to flag utility outages, crew availability, or contamination issues.
- Notify logistics partners about inventory or transport disruptions.
- Coordinate with emergency managers on re-entry or inspection requirements.

Cooperate to Recover

Support economic and supply chain recovery through shared status, staffing, materials data, and recovery priorities.

- Track production restarts across the region using mapped updates.
- Track reopen status using IOIs across facilities and supply routes.
- Upload vendor recovery schedules, damage assessments, and safety notices to DOIs.
- Use check-ins to show staff return-to-duty rates and site reactivation progress.
- Submit SpotReports to highlight production delays or public safety issues.
- Map supply disruptions and restoration timelines for regional coordination.
- Enable coordination of industrial mutual aid (equipment, labor, tech).
- Connect with energy providers to prioritize facility restoration.
- Share resource gaps with local and state recovery coordinators.
- Use shared recovery forms to document output restoration by sector.

□ Organization Type: Insurance Agencies & Adjusters

Insurance agencies are among the most sought-after service providers after a disaster, helping residents and businesses navigate claims, inspections, and financial recovery.

Coordinate in Advance

Pre-map service areas, contact zones, and priority response clients.

- Upload office locations and mobile claim team assignments to shared platform.
- Tag service zones and claims offices as IOIs and preload MyPlans with adjuster rosters and claim packet templates.
- Preload frequently needed policy and contact resources for post-disaster access.
- Define target outreach zones and inspection routes on shared map overlays.

Communicate During Events

Maintain active communication with clients, adjusters, and partners across the map.

- Broadcast status updates to client communities and partner networks.
- Use Announcements to share available staff, field visits, or documentation timelines.
- Notify local response partners when mobile claim centers are deployed.
- Check in staff across multiple field sites using mobile app features.

Cooperate to Recover

Accelerate claims resolution and recovery through mobile data, shared updates, and collaboration.

- Coordinate claim prioritization with local government and business associations.
- Enable cross-agency visibility into coverage zones and inspection progress.
- Assign status to offices and mobile units via IOI status tags.
- Upload inspection logs and escalation procedures to DOIs.
- Check in adjusters from field locations or recovery centers.
- Submit Damage Collector with damage photos or client interaction notes.
- Map recovery zones by claims activity or adjuster deployment.
- Share geotagged documentation of claims activity to support recovery metrics.
- Respond to unmet needs identified by recovery teams through dynamic updates.
- Assist mapping of recovery delays tied to coverage gaps or claim backlogs.

□ Organization Type: Logistics & Delivery Companies

Logistics and delivery companies are the veins of disaster recovery—moving food, fuel, medicine, materials, and emergency equipment across a disrupted region.

Coordinate in Advance

Pre-map anticipated evacuation routes, staging sites, and fleet details of short-haul logistics for fuel, food, and retail access to speed post-disaster movement.

- Register fleet assets, warehouse locations, and driver contact info in app.
- Register logistics hubs and trucks as IOIs and create custom data collection forms for routing sheets integrated with service maps.
- Define staging areas and priority delivery routes using shared maps.
- Upload fuel access plans and alternative routing strategies.

Communicate During Events

Push delivery updates, delivery capacity, outage alerts, and road hazards to partners and drivers.

- Post driver check-ins and delivery route completion using mobile status tools.
- Use SpotReports to broadcast ETA changes, reroutes, or access conditions with tagged maps.
- Update partners on supply arrival times or route disruptions.
- Alert responders to available transport capacity for mutual aid loads.

Cooperate to Recover

Support coordinated recovery by linking transport networks and mapping driver coverage, facility operations, and evolving distribution needs.

- Map logistics flow to identify bottlenecks and coordinate solutions.
- Assign reopen or limited status to each delivery hub or region in IOIs.
- Upload fuel logs, reroute plans, or client SLAs to DOIs for coordination.
- Check in drivers from drop locations to track service activity and route progress.
- Use SpotReports to show unloading delays or damaged deliveries.
- Map zones served and service disruptions across critical lifeline commodities.
- Enable inventory tracking across multiple supply chains.
- Use SpotReports to show deliveries completed or delayed by sector.
- Coordinate between NGOs, local government, and retailers for surge movement.
- Share availability of cold chain or hazardous materials delivery capacity.

□ Organization Type: Multi-Tenant Office Buildings & Business Parks

Multi-tenant office spaces and business parks host a range of professional, health, and service tenants whose recovery affects economic and civic continuity.

Coordinate in Advance

Map office complexes and tenants with backup systems to support recovery visibility and access management.

- Use IOIs to represent buildings with suite lists, landlord contacts, and reentry timelines.
- Upload tenant lists with emergency contacts and business continuity roles.
- Mark buildings with shared infrastructure (generators, HVAC, comms hubs) on maps.
- Define re-entry protocols and inspection priorities using mobile forms.

Communicate During Events

Update tenants, vendors, and responders on facility status, tenant access, infrastructure status, and safety protocols.

- Send operational updates to tenants and responders about access and utilities.
- Post Announcements when elevator, water, or safety systems are compromised or restored.
- Use SpotReports for access control changes, reopening updates, or infrastructure damage.

- Notify cross-sector partners of health risks and service expansion efforts.
- Check in staff and volunteers for shift coordination and safety status.

Cooperate to Recover

Support whole-community recovery by coordinating health, shelter, and social services.
